BAKE SALE CHECKLIST

Here's a step by step guide to help you make your bake sale a successful and fun experience for everyone involved. Your enthusiasm and positive attitude are the most important ingredients in your bake sale. Dream big and believe in yourself and you'll find a way to achieve your goal.

PLAN YOUR BAKE SALE

- Sign up at GreatAmericanBakeSale.org
- □ Set a fundraising goal
- Create a timeline for your sale to help you stay organized
- Consider when and where you might hold your sale
- □ Gather your bake sale recipes (check out our Web site for fun ideas)

SECURE A LOCATION WITH HIGH FOOT TRAFFIC

- □ When choosing a location, think of all the places you go to weekly, i.e., grocery stores, places of worship, farmers' markets, children centers, etc.
- □ Ask your friends and colleagues to help find a location for your sale
- □ If you plan to host your bake sale outside of a local business, be sure to get permission from the manager

- □ Recruit volunteers for your sale and assign each of them a role: purchasing supplies, baking, asking for donations, looking for a location, cleaning up, and setting up
- Get your kids involved! Find kid-friendly recipes and involve them in planning, baking and setting up.

Check out the Send all your friends and family an e-mail about your sale. Promote

- your sale on social networking sites like Facebook, Foodbuzz and Twitter.
- Make posters, flyers and banners and post them throughout your community
- Distribute flyers and information to organizations and businesses that you support
- Download the press release and media alert templates from the Online Participant Resource Center and send them to your local media

BAKE AND GATHER YOUR ITEMS

- Request donations from local bakeries and supermarkets
- Think about which items you can make in advance and freeze or store safely
- □ Offer cultural and neighborhood specialties and items beyond baked goods such as lemonade, ice tea or hot chocolate
- □ Increase the visual appeal of your baked goods by adding garnishes and toppings

INCLUDE HEALTHY OPTIONS

- Make healthy substitutions in recipes by using whole-wheat flour, butter substitutes and including fresh fruit
- □ If possible, include a list of ingredients on the packaging so people with allergies are aware of what is in each item

PACKAGE AND LABEL YOUR GOODS

- □ Use decorative paper, ribbons and stickers to package your goods in a fun and tempting way
- Label all your items neatly with fun titles or descriptions like "Debbie's Famous Carrot Cake"
- □ Have quantities available to suit your customers—singles will like individually wrapped items, large families may prefer whole cakes or pies

SET UP AND DECORATE YOUR TABLE

- Give yourself plenty of time to set up and decorate
- □ Make sure the prices are visible
- □ Use tablecloths, decorative platters and baskets to show off your baked goods
- Deut up your official Great American Bake Sale poster and information sign

HAVE YOUR BAKE SALE!

OTHER WAYS TO RAISE FUNDS

- □ Raffle a specialty item or other prize
- □ Have a donation jar available for additional contributions
- □ Send your friends and family a link to your online web page to donate
- Take orders in advance and deliver them to colleagues and neighbors
- Create a mobile bake sale in your office, college dorm or neighborhood.
 Bake goods and go door to door selling your favorite treats.
